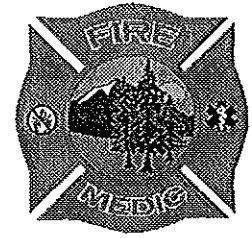




LaPine Fire District Burn Permit



IMPORTANT NOTICES

You are totally responsible and criminally and civilly liable, including suppression costs, for any fire you start. This permit does NOT relieve any responsibility for conducting a safe burn.

You are required to extinguish your fire at any time at the direction of the fire department and/if smoke is causing air quality issues (complaints).

Failure to comply with any permit requirements may result in citation and/or criminal prosecution.

All burning must have on site:

- A copy of this permit
- An able-bodied adult in attendance at all times
- Working water hose, or 5 gallons of water in bucket(s) or "4A rated" fire extinguisher(s)
- Shovel and rake (polaski or hoe type tool OK)

Open debris burns are only allowed during daylight hours (must be completed or put out by dark)

All burning is prohibited if temperatures are above 90°F and wind speeds are predicted to be above 15 MPH.

It is permissible to only burn:

- dry vegetative material
- clean wood or lumber
- dry paper and cardboard

Campfires shall only burn:

- Charcoal briquettes
- Dry firewood

No other materials may be burned.

Clearances:

- All burning shall have 10' minimum clear space (down to bare ground) around pile or campfire ring.
- Debris piles shall be no larger than 15 ft. wide and 6 ft. tall.
- Campfires are limited to 3 ft. wide and 2 ft. tall.
- Debris pile must be 50 ft. from any structures and 25 feet from property line, trees and other piles.
- Campfires must be 25 ft. from structures and 15 ft. from trees.

Tips:

- Call burn line for latest information
- Pay attention to the weather
- Start open debris piles early – must be done by dark or put out.
- Commercial built appliances with chimneys with spark arrestors and/or propane powered devices do not require this permit or open burn regulations (i.e. fireplaces, BBQs)
- The wind in the LaPine area tends to increase in the afternoon.
- The fire must be dead out before you leave the site or conditions change beyond permit limits.
- Call 911 immediately if your fire gets out of control.

Please read completely and fill out last page – Permits are no cost

Open Burning is generally allowed between mid-October and mid-May. No open debris pile burning is allowed during fire season (June, July, August and September).

Call **541-536-9056** before burning to verify it is a burn day.

Campfires in approved rings complying with all rules within this permit are allowed year round unless District is in an extreme fire condition and a total burn ban is in effect.

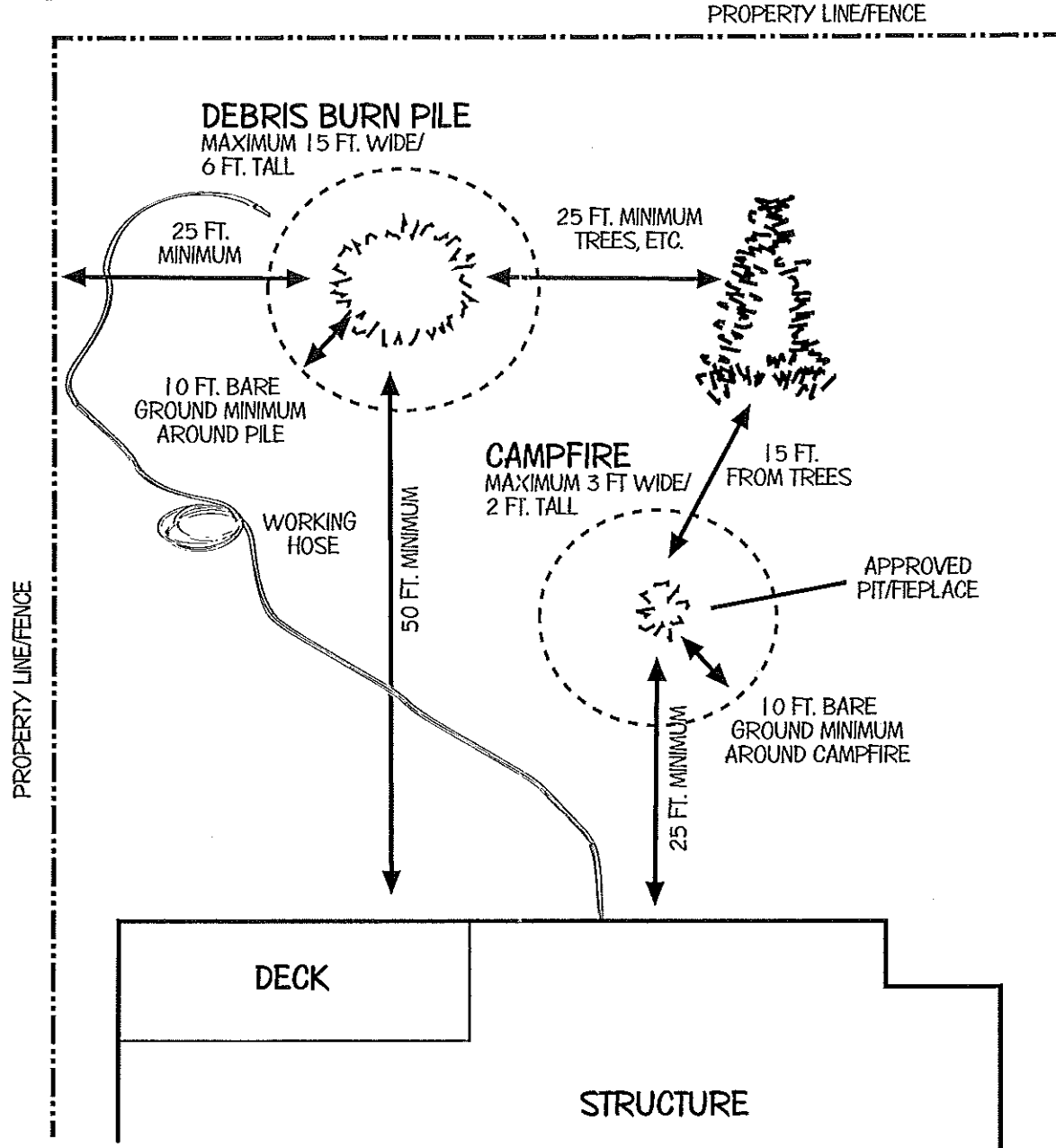

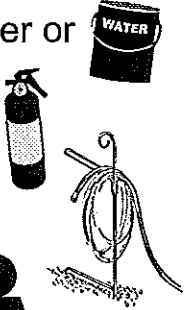

REQUIRED for all burns

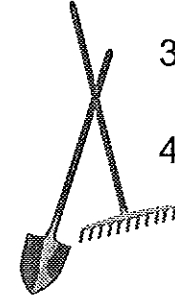
1. Minimum 5 gal water or a 4A extinguisher or working hose
